

RELATIVE CLAUSES – BETREKKELIJKE BIJZIN

- Als je extra informatie over iets of iemand wil geven
- Begint meestal met;
 - *Who*: mensen
 - *Which*: dieren en dingen
 - *That*: mensen, dieren dingen; informeler
- In het Nederlands: die/dat

RELATIVE CLAUSE – BETREKKELIJKE BIJZIN

- Als de extra informatie noodzakelijk is, kan je *which, who, that* weglaten
- My grandmother, who I haven't seen in weeks, is 86 years old.
- The doctor gave me some painkillers, which were very strong.
- That is the book I was talking about.
- Golf is a hobby that is very expensive.
