  - That: mensen, dieren dingen; informeler
- In het Nederlands: die/dat

 Als de extra informatie noodzakelijk is, kan je which, who, that weglaten

- My grandmother, <u>who I haven't seen in weeks</u>, is 86 years old.
- The doctor gave me some painkillers, *which* were very strong.
- That is the book <u>I was talking about</u>.
- Golf is a hobby *that* is very expensive.
