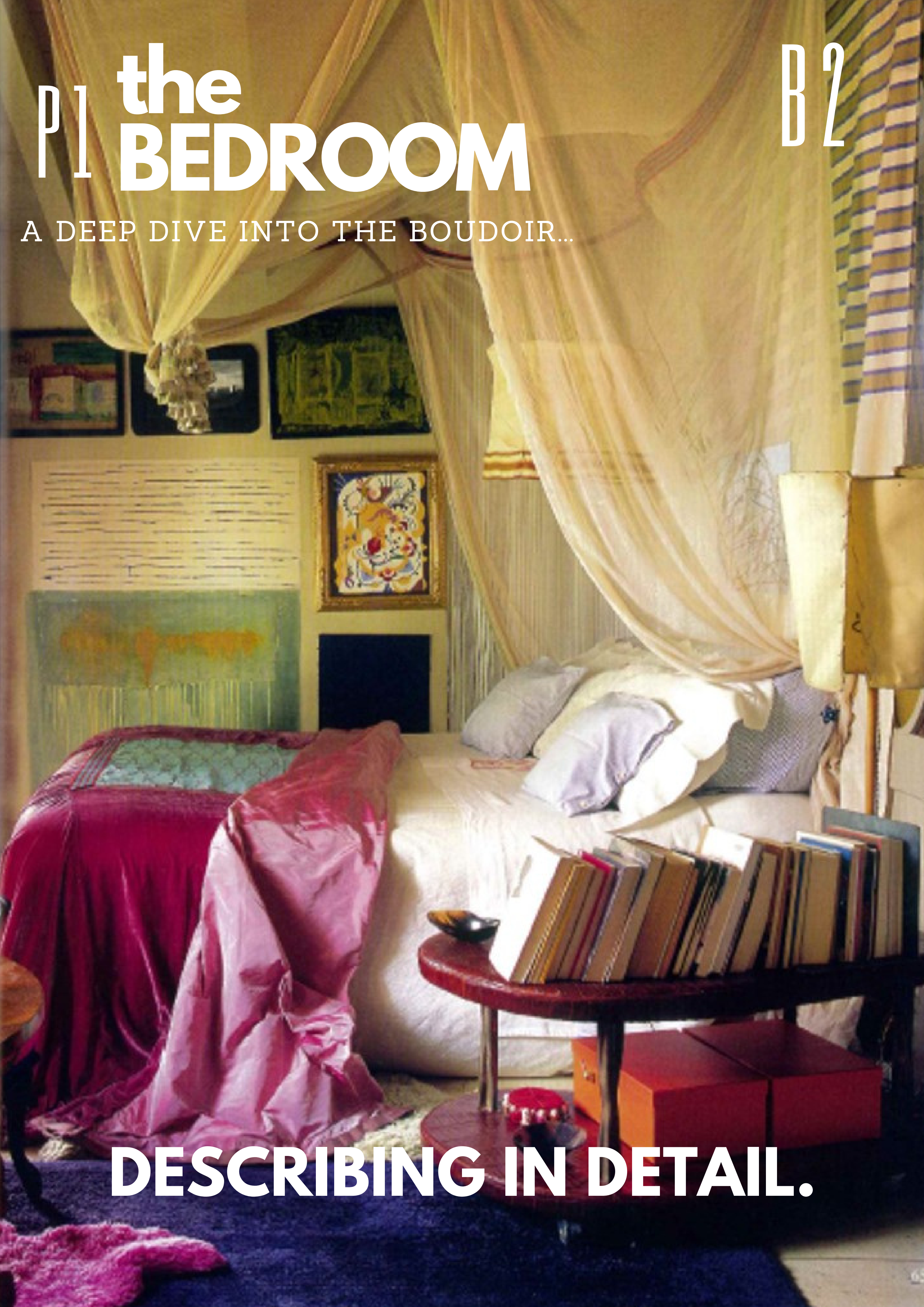

Throw in **Eames furniture** and some **aluminium pendant lamps**, and the result is an inspired blend of polish and poverty.

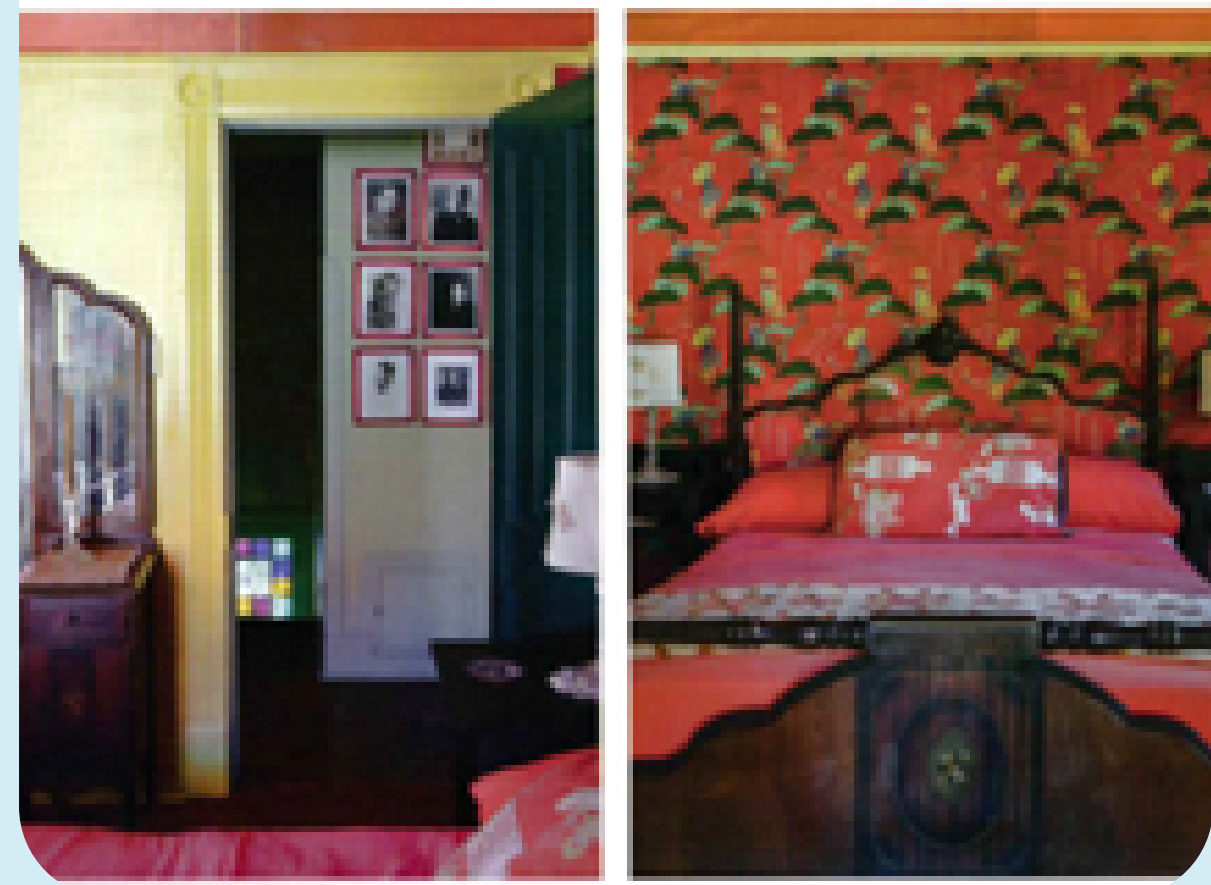
