

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

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Voorwoord

HCE examenidioom Engels vwo bereidt leerlingen zowel voor op het centraal examen leesvaardigheid als op de schoolexamens gespreksvaardigheid en schrijfvaardigheid. Het is door zijn aard en opzet uitstekend geschikt voor zelfstudie. Om dezelfde reden is dit idioomboek ook geschikt voor volwassenen aan dag- en avondscholen.

Bij de samenstelling hebben onder meer de volgende overwegingen een rol gespeeld:

> Onderzoek heeft aangeoond dat er behoefte is om leerlingen zowel voor te bereiden op het CITO-leesvaardigheidsexamen als op de schoolexamens gespreksvaardigheid en schrijfvaardigheid. Vandaar dat een duidelijk onderscheid is aangebracht tussen idioom dat in examens passief beheert dient te worden om de tekst te begrijpen en idioom dat in spreek- en schrijftaal door de leerling zelf actief wordt gebruikt. De woorden worden gescheiden aangeboden, in receptieve en productieve lijsten.

> Elk hoofdstuk begint met een receptieve lijst van 40 woorden, bedoeld om de receptieve woordenschat van de leerling uit te breiden. De opgenomen woorden zijn vooral woorden die in CITO-leesvaardigheidsexamens voorkomen. Vervolgens zijn in een productieve lijst 15 woorden opgenomen die de leerling in schrijf- en spreektaal actief moet kunnen toepassen. Deze lijst bereidt de leerling daarmee dus voor op de schoolexamens gespreksvaardigheid en schrijfvaardigheid. Naast deze 15 woorden zijn per hoofdstuk ook telkens twee taalhandelingen opgenomen, met elk ten minste vier varianten, zodat de gebruiker leert om zich juister, correcter en gevareerdeer uit te drukken in bepaalde situaties. De taalhandelingen sluiten aan bij de ERK-niveaus B1 en B2.

> Het boek bevat 20 hoofdstukken. Het idioom is thematisch gerangschikt. De gekozen thema's beslaan de meest voorkomende onderwerpen in eindexamenteksten. Daarnaast is bij de keuze ook rekening gehouden met de vier profielen Economie en maatschappij, Cultuur en maatschappij, Natuur en techniek, en Natuur en gezondheid. Bovendien wordt in een aantal hoofdstukken aandacht besteed aan idioom dat weliswaar niet expliciet onder de examenonderwerpen valt, maar wel behoert moet worden om teksten te kunnen begrijpen, bijvoorbeeld verbindingswoordjes of woorden die omvang of gradatie aangeven. Elk vijfde hoofdstuk neemt een dergelijk belangrijk woordveld onder de loep.

> Elk opgenomen woord is voorzien van een reële voorbeeldzin. De voorbeeldzin heeft als functie om de betekenis van het woord in een zo duidelijk mogelijke context te zien. •

> Er zijn opdrachten opgenomen waarmee de leerling zichzelf kan toetsen. Per hoofdstuk zijn twee opdrachten opgenomen bij de receptieve lijst en één opdracht bij de productieve lijst.

> Bij de bestudering van het idioom zouden wij de volgende werkwijze willen suggereren:
In de lijst Engels-Nederlands: de vertaling van het aangeboden woord afdekken en uit de voorbeeldzin proberen op te maken wat het woord zou kunnen betekenen. Hierdoor wordt de raadvaardigheid, die bij het tekstbegrip een grote rol speelt, gestimuleerd. Vervolgens controleren of de 'geraden' vertaling juist was.
In de lijst Nederlands-Engels: de Engelse vertaling van de voorbeeldzin afdekken en de vertaling ervan proberen te geven.

> De toevoeging '(BE)' betekent Brits-Engels, '(AE)' betekent Amerikaans-Engels.

> Achter in het boek zijn alfabetische woordenlijsten Engels en Nederlands opgenomen, die het mogelijk maken woorden snel op te zoeken.

> Het los verkrijgbare digiPack biedt de leerling toegang tot een website waar de leerling het idioom op interactieve wijze kan trainen, zich eigen kan maken en kan toetsen. Bovendien kan ook de correcte uitspraak beluisterd worden.

> Voor docent en leerling komen op de methodesite extra tips en ondersteunend materiaal beschikbaar.

Op- of aanmerkingen die tot verbetering van dit boek zouden kunnen leiden, worden bijzonder op prijs gesteld.

Algemene tips voor het omgaan met examenteksten

Stel jezelf bij het lezen tijdens een lesstoets de volgende vragen:

- a Wat voor soort tekst is het? (artikel, verhaal, oproep, reclameboodschap, gebruiksaanwijzing, enzovoort)
- b Hoe is de tekst ingedeeld?
- c Wat betekenen de (sub)titels?
- d Wat kan ik uit de illustratie opmaken?
- e Wat is de bron van de tekst?
- f Voor wie is de tekst geschreven?
- g Wat weet ik al over het onderwerp? (Vanuit andere vakken op school, van de televisie of het internet?)

Tips voor meerkeuzevragen

Lees de tekst door.

- Algemeen geldt dat je eerst steeds een tekst helemaal doorleest en daarbij wat kernwoorden onderstrept of markeert die de inhoud van de tekst globaal weergeven.
- Markeer signalwoorden als: 'however', 'but', 'still', 'although', 'nevertheless', 'on the whole', enzovoort.

Ga daarna pas naar de vragen.

- Om meerkeuzevragen met succes te beantwoorden, geldt als belangrijkste regel dat je eerst de vraag leest, niet de antwoorden.
 - Ga nu terug naar de tekst en bepaal waar in de tekst het antwoord staat.
 - Markeer de kernwoorden in de allinea waar het antwoord staat.
 - Probeer de vraag voor jezelf te beantwoorden.
 - Kijk daarna pas welk antwoord het dichtst bij jouw antwoord komt.
 - Als je twijfelt, geef dan voor jezelf antwoord op de volgende vragen:
 - 1 Is er een antwoord dat heel duidelijk niet in overeenstemming is met de tekst? Streep dat antwoord weg.
 - 2 Zijn er antwoorden die veel op elkaar lijken? Kies het antwoord dat het dichtst bij de tekst staat.

Wat doe je als je een woord niet kent?

- Ga na of je het woord in bijna gelijke vorm vanuit het Nederlands (of een andere taal) kent.
- Heel vaak is het voldoende om ongeveer te weten wat een onbekend woord of bijzondere uitdrukking betekent. Bepaal welke lading een woord gezien de context heeft: positief, negatief, instemmend, afkeurend, enzovoort.
- Bekijk of je de betekenis van het woord nodig hebt voor de beantwoording van de vraag.
- Wanneer je denkt dat het belangrijk is dat je de betekenis van een woord moet weten om de tekst te begrijpen, zoek die dan op in een woordenboek.

Meerkeuze-invulvragen

In sommige teksten is een aantal woorden weggelaten. Jij moet het juiste alternatief kiezen dat moet worden ingevuld.

Ga als volgt te werk:

- Lees de tekst eerst helemaal door.
- Lees eerst alleen de vraag, niet de antwoorden.

- Formuleer je antwoord kort en bondig.
- Voorkom dat je stukken tekst letterlijk in het Nederlands vertaalt.
- Geef precies zoveel antwoorden als er gevraagd worden, als je er meer geeft worden alleen de eerstgegeven antwoorden beoordeeld.
- Lees je antwoord nog eens door en bepaal of het een goedlopend en logisch geheel is.


