3.1 present continuous

present continuous: tegenwoordige tijdsvorm van to be (am / is / are) + werkwoord + -ing

Je gebruikt de **present continuous** om aan te geven dat iets **nu bezig is**, of **aan de gang is** of als je iets **van plan** bent.

bevestigend:

I'm looking for a present. You're looking for a present. He's looking for a present. We're looking for a present.

vragend:

Am I looking for a present? Are you looking for a present? Is he looking for a present? Are we looking for a present?

ontkennend:

I'm not looking for a present. You're not looking for a present. He's not looking for a present. We're not looking for a present.

3.2 past simple

Je gebruikt de past simple (verleden tijd) als iets in het verleden gebeurd is.

bevestigend:

I wanted a normal family. You wanted a normal family. He wanted a normal family. We wanted a normal family.

vragend:

Did I want a normal family? Did you want a normal family? Did he want a normal family? Did we want a normal family?

ontkennend:

I didn't want a normal family. You didn't want a normal family. He didn't want a normal family. We didn't want a normal family.

Past simple van regelmatige werkwoorden:

want - wanted

ask – ask**ed**

werkwoord + -ed

envy – env**ied**

live - lived

Past simple van onregelmatige werkwoorden:

meet - met

come – came

eigen vorm

write - wrote

take - took

3.3 past continuous

past continuous: verleden tijdsvorm van to be (was / were) + werkwoord + -ing

Je gebruikt de past continuous als je zegt wat er op een bepaald moment in het verleden bezig was, of als je zegt wat je toen aan het doen was.

bevestigend:

I was planning my trip.
You were planning your trip.
He was planning his trip.
We were planning our trip.

vragend:

Was I planning my trip? Were you planning your trip? Was he planning his trip? Were we planning our trip?

ontkennend:

I wasn't planning my trip. You weren't planning your trip. He wasn't planning his trip. We weren't planning our trip.

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3.4 present and past

present simple: altijd, nooit, regelmatig

We always get up early.

Do you always get up early?

We don't always get up early.

present continuous: nu bezig / aan de gang

She's opening her presents now.

Is she opening her presents now?

She isn't opening her presents now.

past simple: toen gebeurd

Sophie **told** us about it last night. **Did** Sophie **tell** you about it last night?

Sophie **didn't tell** us about it last night.

past continuous: toen bezig / aan de gang

Sharon was wearing slippers then. Was Sharon wearing slippers then? She wasn't wearing slippers then.

3.5 my-mine-of mine

He's my friend. He's mine. He's a friend of mine. (die van mij) (van mij) (die van jou) He's your friend. He's yours. He's a friend of yours. (van jou) You're his. You're his friend. (die van hem) You're a friend of his. (van hem) You're her friend. You're hers. (die van haar) You're a friend of hers. (van haar) He's our friend. He's a friend of ours. He's ours. (die van ons) (van ons) He's a friend of theirs. (van hun) He's **their** friend. He's **theirs**. (die van hun)

3.6 some \leftrightarrow any

some en any betekenen allebei enige / enkele / een paar

not ... any betekent geen

something / anything= ietsnot ... anythingnietssomebody / anybody= iemandnot ... anybodyniemandsomewhere / anywhere= ergensnot ... anywherenergens

Wanneer some, wanneer any? Dat hangt af van de zin.

bevestigende zin: some ontkennende zin: any vragende zin: any

I had this game **somewhere**. We don't go **anywhere**. Are you going **anywhere** today? I'm looking for **somebody**. I don't know **anybody**. Is **anybody** there?

Let op:

some: Can I have some seafood? Je verwacht het antwoord 'Ja'.

any: Have you got any photos from your trip? Je hebt geen idee wat voor antwoord je krijgt.
